St Patrick


- ✓ He was an apostle of Ireland.

- St. Patrick's day is an annual feast day celebration of Ireland.
- It is traditionally a religious celebration on March 17th.

Symbols of St.Patrick's Day

The Legrechaum is a small Irish fairy. He is dressed like a shoemaker, with pointed shoes and hat. He also wears a leather apron. Lephrechauns are unfriendly little men who lives alone in the forest, spending all of their time making shoes and guarding their treasures.





If you catch a Leprechaun you can bully him into telling you where his treasure is, but be sure not to let him out of your sight or even blink - or he'll disappear!

- Blue was the colour associated with St. Patrick.
- In 1798 the colour green became officially associated with the day.



- Corned beef, cabbage and green beer are traditional fare.
- Less traditional are party foods that are dyed green.



 Since 1962, the Chicago River is dyed green to celebrate St. Patrick's day.
